Waste Management and environment improvement measures to ensure a sustainable Green Campus

Waste Collection and Segregation:

At Rajiv Gandhi Institute of Management & Science, we have established a waste collection system that includes the placement of designated bins for different types of waste.

The campus is equipped with three types of bins:

- 1. Green Bins: For biodegradable or organic waste, including food scraps, paper, and garden waste.
- 2. Blue Bins: For recyclable materials such as paper, plastic, glass, and metal.
- 3. Red Bins: For non-recyclable or residual waste, including items that cannot be composted or recycled.

All members of the college community, including students, faculty, and staff, are encouraged to participate in the waste segregation process by disposing of their waste in the appropriate bins. Clear signage and educational materials are provided to help individuals understand which items belong in each bin.

Waste Handling and Disposal:

Once the waste is collected from the campus bins, it is transported to the designated waste management facility operated by the local Panchayat. The Panchayat is responsible for further sorting, processing, and disposal of the waste in accordance with municipal regulations and environmental standards.

Collaboration with the Panchayat:

We maintain a collaborative partnership with the local Panchayat to ensure the effective management of waste generated on campus. Regular communication and coordination are maintained between college authorities and Panchayat officials to address any issues related to waste collection, segregation, or disposal.
